While driving at various speeds, the alternator overheated, causing a small fire in the wiring behind the alternator. Consumer extinguished the fire and had the vehicle towed. The vehicle was not under warranty, so the dealer was not notified. The fire was small, so the consumer did not report it to the police or fire department.
