**Subject:** Defect in my 1997 Chevrolet Blazer

To whom it may concern-

I have a 1997 2-door Chevrolet Blazer LS. I have had a problem with the fuel gage for the past year. The gage does not read properly and has yet to show the correct amount of gas in my car since it has become defected. I should also let you know that no incident has occurred that would trigger a defect in the gage or cause it to misread. I have run out of gas numerous times because of the false reading. I have also taken my car to several mechanics for the problem, only to be told that the fuel tank would need to be removed and checked out, which would end up costing me near \$1,000, so I have yet to get it fixed because of the cost and labor involved. I have heard from many people that they have had the same problems with the fuel gage on their GM models as well, and I know that there has been a recall for Jeeps with the same problem but not with GMs. I was wondering if this problem could be looked into because I am concerned that this might be a problem with the manufacturer.
