Dear Volkswagen Owner:

As part of Volkswagen's commitment to our environment, we would like to inform you of our decision to extend your Emissions Control Systems Warranty for mass air flow sensors to 7 years or 70,000 miles (115,000 km), whichever occurs first, from the vehicle's original in-service date.

The vehicle's original in-service date is defined as the date the vehicle was delivered to either the original purchaser or the original lessee, or if the vehicle was first placed in service as a "demonstrator" or "company" car, on the date such vehicle was first placed in service.

The mass air flow sensor is an important emission control device which, in the event it malfunctions, causes the MIL light on your instrument panel to come on and may adversely affect the drivability of your vehicle. For additional information concerning your Emissions Control Systems Warranty, please consult your Warranty Booklet or your dealer.

If the mass air flow sensor in your vehicle should malfunction, your Volkswagen dealer will replace it without charge, as long as the vehicle remains within the above time and mileage limits.

Please keep this letter with your Warranty booklet and deliver it to any new owner, along with the Owners Manual.

If you have previously paid for replacement of the mass air flow sensor, the enclosed form explains how to request reimbursement. We would be pleased to review your reimbursement request.

We are pleased to offer this extended emissions warranty and hope that you will continue to be a member of the Volkswagen family. Thank you for driving a Volkswagen!

The vehicle identified below has been inspected to determine if it is emitting excessive amounts of exhaust and/or evaporative emissions. The inspection consists of an exhaust test for Hydrocarbons (HC) and Carbon Monoxide (CO), or a check of the vehicle's on-board diagnostic (OBD) computer system (1996 and newer OBD-equipped vehicles only) for indication of malfunctions causing or leading to excessive emissions. Also included is a check of the vehicle's gas cap for leaks. CO is a colorless, odorless, toxic gas. HC is unburnt fuel that, when emitted into the air, contributes to the formation of ground-level ozone (smog). Ground-level ozone is a respiratory irritant that causes eye and throat discomfort and damages breathing passages.
