Dear Sirs:

I am providing this letter as a follow up to our correspondences in the latter part of 2004 in reference to my clients and the vehicle listed above. My clients have previously provided this information to Hyundai and their dealership and were ignored. We have written numerous correspondences without any satisfaction.

I wish to bring to your attention, once again, the following concerns:

1. Within two weeks of purchase of the vehicle, while stopped at a toll gate on I-44 by Miami, Oklahoma, the engine blew up when the car had less than 800 miles accumulated. As a result, the right side of the motor disintegrated.

2. Following the repair, the passenger side window would not work;
3. The car engine would surge; and
4. The sun roof was broken; and
5. The paint was peeling.
6. On March 8, 2004, in Joplin, Missouri, the brakes failed, the seatbelt broke, and airbags failed to deploy.


As a result of the brakes failing, there was a collision with additional body damage to the vehicle. The total cost of the vehicle was \$21,368.00, which a 2002 PT Cruiser was traded in on.

Also as a result of the collision from the failed brakes, my client sustained a shoulder injury with additional deep bone bruises and has been receiving treatment from Dr. Fields.

It is my clients' opinion that Hyundai has been given ample opportunities to repair this vehicle. As a result, we are once again bringing you on notice of our intent to proceed under the lemon laws if this matter is not resolved immediately.
