Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing to you because I do not know where to turn. I purchased a Nissan Maxima 2005, from Atlantic Nissan, 193-205 Sunrise Highway, West Islip, New York. This car presently has approximately 3300 miles. This car has twice lurched forward with the engine racing at top speed. The last occurrence was when we boarded the Ferry from Bridgeport, CT., to Port Jefferson, NY. in which we narrowly averted an accident when the engine ran away. I jammed on my brake and threw the gear into neutral. This happened once before, about three weeks prior to this, on the Belt Parkway. Should this occur again I am not certain that I could be so lucky.

I brought the car back to the Dealer [see included copies of work sheets] who kept the car for several hours, after which I was told that nothing could be found. This constitutes a genuine and grave danger to my life and limb for both myself and my wife, who also drives this car. I am therefore requesting your help in either finding the cause for this situation or declaring that I have purchased a "LEMON" and that a new Nissan Maxima 2005 replace this dangerously deficient car.
