I am forwarding this correspondence with hope that you can assist with the solution to a problem I am having with my 2003 Mitsubishi Montero. The service staff at Orr Mitsubishi, Shreveport, Louisiana, has been very gracious and courteous in their efforts to solve this problem, but the problem still exists. Maybe your engineering staff is familiar with a similar problem and knows what corrective action should be taken.

I have an apparent problem with ^{the} transfer system – the warning light is doing exactly what is indicated on the attached illustrations from my owner's manual. The problem does not happen at any set interval or number of miles. When the light flashes and I stop, turn off the engine, and restarts, the system works normally. However, after a day or so the light will begin flashing again.

I will be most appreciative of any assistance you can render in the solution to this problem. Thanking you in advance for your consideration.

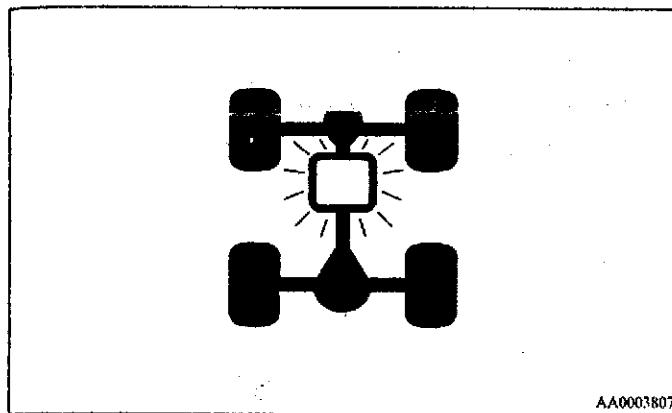

 <p data-bbox="215 495 509 548">Center differential lock light (flashes slowly)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="589 401 1159 428">● Park your vehicle in a safe place and stop the engine. <li data-bbox="618 428 1230 455">Restart the engine and check to see if the light flashes again. <li data-bbox="589 455 1398 510">● If the light flashes again, have the vehicle checked at an authorized Mitsubishi dealer as soon as possible.



⚠ CAUTION

- If a problem is detected in the transfer system, a safety device will activate. The front and rear wheel lights will go out, the center differential lock light will blink (once per second), and transfer shifting will become impossible. Park your vehicle in a safe place, turn off the engine for a few moments. Restart the engine.
The lights should resume normal operation. If the lights continue to blink, have the vehicle checked by an authorized Mitsubishi dealer as soon as possible.
