Thank you for your correspondence dated July 26, 2006, concerning your model year (MY) 2000 Daewoo Nubira vehicle. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation (ODI) received your correspondence on August 7, 2006. We regret any inconvenience our delay in responding may have caused you.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns. In order for the agency to initiate an investigation, we look carefully at the body of consumer complaints and other available data to determine whether a defect may exist. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

The information you have provided has been entered into our database and will be reviewed. It will be considered with other reports to identify any recall inadequacies that may require our attention. A copy of your request for reimbursement in regard to Daewoo Motor America's camshaft position sensor has been provided to ODI's Recall Management Division for their review. 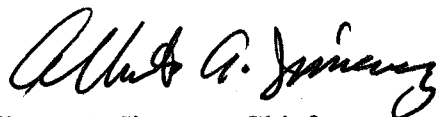
