Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing to file a formal complaint against the Daewoo Motor Company. I am just one of the unfortunate consumers who was dumb enough to buy one of their vehicles and now I am paying the price.

I have filed a formal complaint with my state's Attorney General's office but I am writing to you in the hopes that they will no longer be able to sell unsafe vehicles to the rest of the public.

I bought my Daewoo in March 2003. The salesperson was slick. He stated they had recently bought out a dealership in a nearby city and there would be no problems getting parts. He stated this because we specifically asked him about it, because obviously there are not that many Daewoos on the road. Of course we thought that maybe it would be an up and coming car company, like Hyundai used to be.

Over a year later, too late to apply the lemon law to our vehicle, we received a recall notice. It involved the Camshaft position sensor. The recall notice stated that the wiring for this part could be thrown out of whack and cause the service engine light to come on and in extreme cases cause an underhood fire. Then we received a second recall notice involving the brake lines. This recall stated that the brake lines were defective and could rust, causing loss of the brakes. Now, I have received a second notice on the Camshaft position sensor, but of course, the dealership I bought the car from has been unable to obtain the parts to fix the two recalls. Also, other things have gone wrong with the vehicle and I really don't feel that the vehicle itself is all that sound, in fact, I think the whole framework of the vehicle is suspect. It is only a four year old car with 43,000 miles on it. Should it be creaking when I apply the brakes? I am not talking about the brakes themselves, I am speaking of the whole car. Plus, the driver's side door handle snapped off and the left side rear window no longer works. It is automatic. I have owned maybe six cars since I started driving and all but one had automatic windows, and those windows never broke and my door handles never snapped off.

As I said, I am filing a complaint against the company and the dealership in particular in my state of Massachusetts. I just wanted my complaint on file with as many people as possible so that the company can no longer sell unsafe vehicles to the general public. I would take them to small claims court, but I can't afford an attorney. I was hoping that maybe, if someone begins a class action lawsuit against them that I could be a complainant in that suit.
