[REDACTED] We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or safety defect recall adequacy is warranted.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's vehicle complaint database contains reports from vehicle owners residing in the U. S. and its territories, e.g., Puerto Rico. It does not contain report from other countries; expect Canada, mainly from vehicle owners who purchased their vehicles in the U. S.

A review of our complaint database relative to problems associated with model years 2004 and 2005 Nissan Armada vehicle revealed no reports similar to that which you encountered, automatic transmission jumping out of park. The information you provided will be entered our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
