Thank you for your correspondence inquiring into safety defect recalls for your model year (MY) 2006 Chrysler Sebring vehicle. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation received your correspondence on April 2, 2007.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations. In order for the agency to initiate an investigation, we look carefully at the body of consumer complaints and other available data to determine whether a defect may exist. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

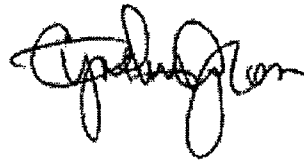
NHTSA is aware of DaimlerChrysler's safety defect recall (NHTSA Campaign No. 04V-579) concerning damaged right steering knuckles in certain MY 2005 Chrysler Sebring vehicles. However, DaimlerChrysler has not issued another safety defect recall for subsequent MY 2006 vehicles. Therefore, NHTSA cannot require DaimlerChrysler to perform the corrective action your vehicle at no cost to you.
