Thank you for your correspondence requesting a change of address. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on April 24, 2007.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

Regarding your request to change your address, we suggest you contact Acura Client Services at 1-800-382-2238 or by mail at 1919 Torrance Blvd., Torrance, CA 90501-2746. Also, for your information, whenever a safety related recall is authorized, manufacturers are required to notify all registered owners and purchasers affected by a safety defect recall by first class mail. Manufacturers obtain the addresses of vehicle owners from State motor vehicles offices. Please also notify your local Department of Motor Vehicles of your address change.
