Thank you for your correspondence dated May 9, 2007, concerning brake noise and heating problems on your Model Year (MY) 2003 Airstream motorhome. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on May 22, 2007. We regret any inconvenience our delay in responding may have caused you.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

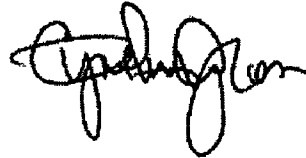
██████████, the affected Bosch/Zops brake calipers on the W22/W20 chassis population were manufactured between the dates of August 10, 2000 through June 29, 2002. The "P" chassis was manufactured after June 29, 2002 and did not have Bosch/Zops brake calipers. Therefore, the "P" chassis was excluded from NHTSA recall campaign 04V084000. We appreciate the report you provided; the information has been entered into our database and will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
