Thank you for your correspondence dated September 28, 2007, concerning your model year (MY) 2002 Nissan Sentra vehicle. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on October 11, 2007.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. However, we cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or expansion of a safety defect recall is warranted e.g., NHTSA safety defect recall campaign No. 03V477000.

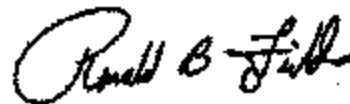
A review of our database relative to BCM failure in MY 2002 Nissan Sentra vehicles not involved in NHTSA safety defect recall campaign No. 03V477000 revealed insufficient evidence to warrant expanding the scope of the recall at this time. The information you provided has been entered into our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends or recall inadequacies that may require our attention.



Concerning the reimbursement request, this does not fall under our jurisdiction. If you have not done so, you may consider contacting your local Consumer Protection Agency, Better Business Bureau, or the Texas Office of the Attorney General regarding your request. We also recommend you continue to work with Nissan of North America.
