Thank you for your correspondence dated September 11, 2007, concerning the problem your son encountered with your model year (MY) 1998 Chevrolet Blazer. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission referred your correspondence to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). The Office of Defects Investigation received your correspondence on December 19, 2007.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. However, we cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.


We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or safety defect recall adequacy is warranted.

We sympathize with you concerning the service problems you reported and your request for reimbursement; however, this does not fall under our jurisdiction. If you have not done so, you may consider contacting the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). The FTC has jurisdiction over non-safety defects, paint, fraud or deception, warranty and dealership problems, remuneration matters, and fair trade practices.
