Thank you for your correspondence concerning a recall (NHTSA Recall Campaign No. 07V-336) involving your model year (MY) 1994 Mercury Grand Marquis vehicle. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on January 14, 2008.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. However, we cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or safety defect recall adequacy is warranted.

NHTSA is aware of the back order for the parts related to NHTSA Recall Campaign No. 07V-336 and is continuing to monitor the situation. With having the speed control deactivation switch disconnected, this will mitigate the safety aspect of the defect and will complete the recall campaign. Owners who receive the interim remedy will be notified by Ford Motor Company when the fused jumper harnesses are available; as a customer satisfaction campaign (not part of the recall). Ford will then reconnect the speed control system at no cost to the vehicle owners.
