Thank you for your correspondence dated February 25, 2008, concerning your model year (MY) 2001 GMC Yukon vehicle. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on March 6, 2008.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. However, we cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or safety defect recall adequacy is warranted.

This is concerning GMC safety defect recall (NHTSA Campaign No. 05V379000) for unwanted ABS brake activation and your request to include the State of Virginia for MY 2001 GMC Yukon vehicles. At this time, there are no other similar complaints in our database for that state; therefore, providing insufficient evidence to warrant expanding the recall. The information you provided has been entered into our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention. Please be aware NHTSA monitors all recalls. However, the expansion of said recall at this time for the State of Virginia is not a consideration.
