Thank you for your correspondence dated March 18, 2008, concerning the availability of recall parts for your model year (MY) 2001 Ford Econoline Van. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation received your correspondence on March 26, 2008.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns. In order for the agency to initiate an investigation, we look carefully at the body of consumer complaints and other available data to determine whether a defect may exist. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

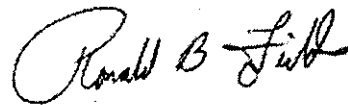
We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. We regret any problems you may be experiencing with your vehicle. The combined Ford Motor Company speed control deactivation switch recall (NHTSA Campaign No. 07V-336) involves over 11 million vehicles. As a result, there is no simple way to quickly procure service parts for vehicles on that scale. Ford has assured us that parts will be available June 2008. The interim remedy for NHTSA safety recall 08V-051 is to disconnect the speed control switch. This will mitigate the safety aspect of the defect and will complete the recall campaign. If the safety-related corrective action for the recall has not been performed, NHTSA strongly recommends that work be accomplished on your 2001 Ford Econoline as soon as possible by making an appointment any authorized Ford dealer. Owners who receive the interim remedy will be notified by Ford Motor Company when the fused wiring harnesses are available.
