Thank you for your correspondence dated March 18, 2008, concerning your model year (MY) 2008 Audi A6 vehicle. Your correspondence was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation on March 26, 2008.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain serious safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. However, we cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Each report is analyzed and entered into a database to determine whether an investigation into a possible safety defect or safety defect recall adequacy is warranted.


We have reviewed our database in an effort to identify whether a safety defect trend exists with regard to stalling problems in MY 2008 Audi A6 vehicles. At this time, there are no other similar complaints in our database; therefore, insufficient evidence to warrant opening a safety defect investigation. The information you provided has been entered into our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.

If you have not done so, you may consider contacting your local Consumer Protection Agency, Better Business Bureau, or the New York Office of the Attorney General regarding your problem and your rights under the New York Lemon Law. You may also ask your dealership for a meeting with the district manager regarding your problem.
