Comments:

I purchased a 2004 Nissan Armada new from Habberstad Nissan in Hungtington NY. I have a four year lease and during the last 3 1/2 years I have had to repair or replace the brakes five (5) times. THE last time the brake pedal actually went to the floor almost causing a severe and possibly life threatening accident. Nissan has known from the very beginning that the brake system on the 2004 Armada and Titan trucks were too small for the car and still allow these trucks on the road. Today I actually received a copy of a Nissan Corporate Service Memo from May 2006 that details a problem with the ABS system on the 2004 Armada and Titan trucks which was never applied to my car until approximately one month ago only after a near accident occurred. This was two years after the memo and probably three different brake related services to the car. I have asked Nissan to repurchase this car (there are only three or four months left on the lease) and get it off of the road before it does kill someone but they have refused. To allow this to continue until a death does occur is just not acceptable and AG Cuomo needs to take care of this issue in order to protect the public he serves. Nissan should not be allowed to put and keep unsafe automobiles on the road. I hope to hear from you soon. Thank you.
