I am not sure if being the second owner of this car can help us. I know Chrysler always blames the consumer for the sludge problem. The lemon law of NY state didn't cover this car because when we realized how bad this car was the lemon law was no longer applicable.

We are now stuck with a car loan and a car that doesn't work. Please put this matter in your records and add our experience to any action you are planning re the Dodge Intrepid and the 2.7 engine. . The world must be saved from this kind of greed and bad workmanship.
