Thank you for your correspondence dated June 3, 2009, concerning your model year (MY) 2000 Chevrolet Impala. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation received your correspondence on June 17, 2009.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns. In order for the agency to initiate an investigation, we look carefully at the body of consumer complaints and other available data to determine whether a defect may exist. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. In your letter, you indicated that your vehicle was destroyed in an underhood fire on January 13, 2009, due to a defect specified in NHTSA campaign 09V-116.

We sympathize with you concerning the problem you reported; however, the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act requires a manufacturer to remedy the noncompliance or safety-related defect without charge to the owner; however, it does not require manufacturers to reimburse vehicle owners for other costs associated with the safety defect, including damage caused by a vehicle fire. Nor does the Act authorize the Federal government to reimburse vehicle owners for any costs associated with safety recalls.
