Thank you for your correspondence dated March 25, 2009, concerning the Michelin PAX run flat tires equipped on your model year (MY) 2006 Nissan Quest vehicle. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation received your correspondence on July 15, 2009.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or items of motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns. In order for the agency to initiate an investigation, we look carefully at the body of consumer complaints and other available data to determine whether a defect may exist. We cannot act on isolated problems or resolve disputes between individual owners, dealers, or manufacturers.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. In your letter, you indicated that after purchasing your MY 2006 Nissan Quest vehicle equipped with Michelin PAX run flat tires, you encountered a tire problem, and was unable to have the problem resolved by an authorized Michelin retail center or your Nissan dealership.

A review of our database relative to problems associated with Michelin PAX run flat tires revealed insufficient evidence to warrant opening a safety defect investigation at this time. The information you provided has been entered into our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
