The attached photos show the reason the information was filed. The frame broke while traveling about five miles an hour, about one-half block from the repair shop. It pulled the car violently to the left. When the mechanic drove it on the road at about thirty MPH it pulled the car violently in to the left lane. The photos of the tires show how towed in the wheel are while sitting at rest. The photo of the frame shoes the area of the break next to the right front wheel.
