David Strickland, There was a horrific 2 car accident near Okemos Michigan that killed 5 people and left the remaining 4 hospitalized this past Sunday, 10/11/2010. A 2002 Toyota Prius crossed over a grass median between a divided expressway and struck a Chevy Blazer. I've seen the photos of the vehicles and there is nothing but crumpled metal of the Toyota. How does a car with 4 exemplary college students, all active in their communities, all wearing their belts, on a sunny Sunday afternoon cross over a grassy median and strike another car with such force that there is nothing left of their car. Only 1 passenger survived from the Toyota and nothing has been reported except that the driver was alert at the time of the accident. This is a horrific story but it is too suspicious especially with all the reports of Toyota's acceleration and steering problems. I am writing this so that you are aware of it. Sincerely [REDACTED]
