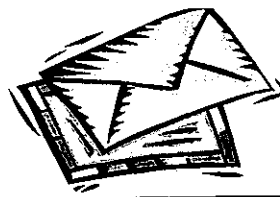

Dear Senator Cornyn:

Thank you for your letter on behalf of your constituent, [REDACTED] of Laredo, concerning the repairs she had made on her car in response to the Toyota recall.

For your information, the Federal Trade Commission has been directed by Congress to act in the interest of all consumers to prevent deceptive or unfair practices and unfair methods of competition, pursuant to the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. 41 *et seq.* In determining whether to take enforcement or other action in any particular situation, the Commission may consider a number of factors, including the type of violation alleged; the nature and amount of consumer injury at issue and the number of consumers affected; and the likelihood of preventing future unlawful conduct and securing redress or other relief. I would like to emphasize that letters from consumers like you provide valuable information that is frequently used to develop or support Commission enforcement initiatives.

I appreciate learning of your concerns; however, I should note that the jurisdiction of the Commission under the FTC Act does not extend to the situation described. Therefore, I have taken the liberty of forwarding your letter to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration for review. Again, thank you for your interest in this matter, and please let me know whenever we can be of service.

To begin with there was no topic for my complaint.

I purchased a 2008 Toyota Corolla from Mike Shaw Kia, Corpus Christi on Dec. 22, 2010; paid cash. The car had a Toyota recall for the computer which was not attended to; I had to replace all 4 tires. Pep Boys notified me that a tire sensor/valve was defective. On Jan. 4, 2011 I called Kia and spoke with a gentleman, Tim Starling, who claimed to be the general manager. He authorized me to make the repair and agreed to pay \$200; anything over that amount was my out of pocket expense. On Jan. 5 I made the repair at Powell Watson Toyota in Laredo and faxed the receipt to Mike Shaw Kia as Starling had instructed me to do. As of March 15, 2011 Mike Shaw KIA did not reimburse me the money. I filed a complaint with BBB Austin but without warning they emailed me that the case could not proceed. I filed out the complaint form at the TX Attorney General's Office and they wrote me a lot of jibberish which sounds like they won't handle the problem either.

I am appealing to you as a senior citizen, retired teacher (of not that many years), and a Texas citizen/resident. This is not a fair way for a 'legitimate' business to conduct itself. They NEVER provided me with a copy of the 90 day warranty; maybe it covered things they didn't want to back up. The whole experience was negative.

I can submit or attach documentation if required. Please advise.
