This is my second attempt to contact your agency, the first time I did so was around 2007-2008, when the first problem occurred with my 2004 Chevy Malibu, when the "Service Airbag light came on".

I did at the time take it Firestone, clearly being told by Sam Clark the manager, that there was nothing service on airbags. This vehicle has since been sold. But shortly after selling it, I was informed by the police this vehicle was in an accident, but I did nothing as I had sold it. Now I keep thinking, was the recalled defects have anything to do with this accident. I do believe the police dept can provide the necessary records of this accident.

There is another interesting connection to these problems. I also own a 2003 S 10 Chevy crew cab, and another 2007 Chevy Malibu where the service airbag lights come on. I even took a photographs, which I will attach to show. these lights are coming while the vehicle is in motion. My question is:- Will my airbag function in an accident? or will these same airbags accidentally go off, while the car is being driven, and cause an accident. No one seems to provide me an answer.

The 2004 Malibu was even taken to the local dealership:- Bravo Chevrolet where Mike Rodriguez, the service advisor tells me, it is probably a sensor, under the front seat, cost \$ 700.00. to replace. This was on/ around 2007-2008 time period. These lights in question come on and off periodically. There should be extensive records at Firestone as well as with Bravo dealership, and may require digging them up.
