Dear NHTA,

I am requesting that you add this information to the safety complaint - ODI # 10916105-
I filed on 14 Oct 16, concerning the defective electronic brake control on my 2008 Corvette.

The first indication of a problem occurred while driving my car. The dash started flashing a message to service the ABS, the traction control, and some other brake related message. The brakes still worked so I drove the car a number of times before and during the diagnosis and repair of the issue. Initial diagnosis indicated the right front wheel speed sensor and harness were bad. After replacement the dash was still sending the same service the brake signals as before. Further testing showed the electronic brake control was defective. A new ECM was installed and that fixed the problem.

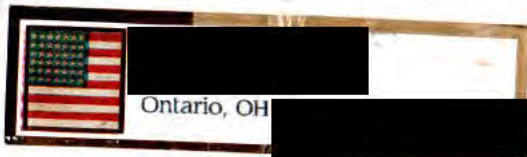
However, while driving the car before it was fixed, I experienced one incident where I came to a stop at a stop sign. When starting to continue at the stop sign, the brakes came on of their own volition and tried to stop the car halfway into the intersection. I gave the car more gas and it started moving. That is the only incident that occurred in the few times the car was driven before the new ECM was installed. (OVER)

After the car was fixed, I spoke with a mechanic and asked him about the car braking itself incident. He said that because the ECM was defective, it was sending braking signals because it thought something was wrong. It could do this at any time and any speed. I Googled issues the ECM on a 5.5 or 6.0 Corvette and found quite a few people not happy and wondering why there wasn't a recall for this. It cost me \$2528.97 to fix it. Might be the reason why GM has not done a recall.
