To Whom It May Concern:

The following incident took place on Thursday, January 25, 2018 @ 12:30 PM. Road and driveway conditions were clear and dry. The vehicle involved is a 2017 Lexus NX 200t.

I made a left hand turn into our driveway off of Evans Road. The mail truck had just gone so I decided to get the mail. I put my right foot on the brake to stop the vehicle, put the vehicle in park, unfastened my seat belt, opened the driver's door and exited the vehicle. I started walking towards the mailbox and saw out of the corner of my eye that the vehicle was moving forward up our driveway while in park. I ran towards the vehicle and attempted to get back in the vehicle while it was moving to stop it, but fell backwards out of the vehicle and landed on my left side next to the moving vehicle and the back tire on the driver's side ran over my right foot and drug me approximately one foot. I then proceeded to get up and run towards the vehicle again in an attempt to get back in. I was successful this time, however the vehicle hit our garage and one garage door and bounced back. I looked down and the gear shift was still in the park position and I pushed the start/stop button to shut off the engine.

My injuries that I sustained consisted of bilateral foot hairline fractures, a contusion of the left knee, and left elbow/groin/rib discomfort. I was transported by Bally Ambulance to Pottstown Memorial Medical Center Emergency Room where xrays and cat scans were taken of both my feet and ankles. An xray was also taken of my left knee. From there I

was taken by private vehicle for further evaluation by Dr. Benjamin Overley, a foot/ankle orthopedic surgeon. I wore a walking boot for three weeks, followed up with Dr. Overley, and completed two and a half weeks of physical therapy. I returned to work on Monday, March 12, 2018.

A pair of jeans and a pair of Nike sneakers were damaged in the incident.

The body work on the vehicle has been repaired and I am presently waiting to hear back from corporate Lexus. A technician from Lexus came out to retrieve information from the computer on my vehicle on Monday, February 19, 2018. I have been told it will take up to one month until I hear in writing through the mail what the findings were – I was informed that the letter will be from their legal department.

Throughout these past several weeks I have not only been dealing with the trauma of being run over, pain and suffering, and the inability to work, but the lack of communication and empathy from Lexus. The dealership was not even willing to set me up with a loaner vehicle because the vehicle was not on their property but at the body shop where they instructed me to have it towed.
