I am requesting current status of Vehicle Safety Complaint # 11181259 filed on Feb. 19, 2019.

This is in reference of GM Special coverage adjustment # [REDACTED] for defective Fuel Pumps for 2008 Corvettes.

GM has a total of 234 fuel related issues with the 2008 Corvette, (see link).

These are fuel leaks, vapor fumes from the Fuel Pumps on the gas tank above the exhaust system of which all should be addressed as a potential Fire Safety Hazard. I can't leave my car in the garage because of the fuel vapor smell, have to leave it outside.

If I fill the tank I get smell fuel inside the car and outside by the drivers door.

I spoke to my local Chevrolet dealer and only to be told that I missed the cut off date by 3 months for no cost repair on the issue.

I never received a recall anything about this issue, I only learn about it when I started having a problem.

I need some help to get GM to honor my vehicle for this issue.

Please be advised that I have also filed a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission # [REDACTED] on May 10, 2019.

I have spoke to General Motors customer service on May 13, 2019 with absolutely no help with this issue.
