Thank you for your correspondence concerning your model year (MY) 2018 Porsche Macan vehicle. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation (ODI) received your correspondence. I am pleased to respond.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's roadways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the completion rates and adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. We reviewed our database in an effort to identify whether a safety defect trend exists with regard to headlights being too dim or aimed incorrectly in MY 2018 Porsche Macan vehicles. At this time, we lack evidence to open a safety defect investigation or to initiate a recall. We entered the information you provided into our database. It will be considered with future reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
