Thank you for your letter about your model year (MY) 2015 Jayco Precept motorhome. Your letter was forwarded to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation. I am pleased to respond.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for NHTSA. Jayco sent you the notification for NHTSA Safety Recall Campaign No. 19V-270. The recall instructs Jayco dealers to replace the 40-amp blower motor fuse with a 25-amp fuse. You state that you could not find a 25-amp fuse at your local auto parts stores, so you used a 20-amp fuse instead.

We appreciate your diligence in making sure your vehicle is safe and the 20-amp fuse should work. However, recalls are very specific in regard to vehicle build dates, affected vehicle identification numbers (VIN), assembly plants, remedy procedures, and defective components. At your convenience we recommend that you contact a Jayco dealer and make an appointment to have the 25-amp fuse installed free of charge.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's roadways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the completion rates and adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns.
