Thank you for the letter about your model year (MY) 2013 Ford Edge vehicle. Your letter was received by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation (ODI). I am pleased to respond.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's highways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair motor vehicles or motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the completion rates and adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. ODI has received reports similar to yours and is monitoring all available data concerning allegations of door ajar light and interior dome light illumination caused by door latch failures in MY 2011 through MY 2013 Ford Edge vehicles. While we continue to monitor this issue, no investigation has been opened nor determinations reached at this time. We entered your information into our database. It will be used with other reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
