Thank you for the letter about your model year (MY) 2019 Volkswagen Tiguan vehicle. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation received your letter. I am pleased to respond.

NHTSA is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's roadways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects in their design, construction, or performance. We also monitor the completion rates and adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. We reviewed our database to identify whether a safety defect trend exists with the automatic braking system in MY 2019 Volkswagen Tiguan vehicles. At this time, our records did not identify enough evidence to open a safety defect investigation or to initiate a recall. However, NHTSA is reviewing the safety and reliability of all advanced driver aid systems in manufacturers' vehicles across the industry. We entered your information into our database. It will be used with other reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention. We recommend that you continue to work with Volkswagen and your local dealer to resolve this matter.
