Thank you for the letter about your model year (MY) 2019 Hyundai Sonata vehicle. I am pleased to respond.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is the Federal agency responsible for improving safety on our Nation's roadways. We are authorized to order manufacturers to recall and repair vehicles or motor vehicle equipment when our investigations indicate that they contain safety defects, such as in their design, construction, or performance. Among other activities, we also monitor the completion rates and adequacy of manufacturers' recall campaigns.

We appreciate the report you provided. Reports from motorists are a very important source of information for NHTSA. We received a previous report from you regarding your vehicle problem through our Vehicle Safety Hotline on July 27, 2021. Please note that when a motorist contacts NHTSA, their complaint does not automatically open a formal investigation by our agency.

We reviewed our database to identify whether a safety defect trend exists with the front seat belts in MY 2019 Hyundai Sonata vehicles. At this time, NHTSA has not identified sufficient evidence to open a safety defect investigation or to initiate a recall. However, we entered your information into NHTSA's database, where it will be used with other reports to identify any safety defect trends that may require our attention.
