Thank you for contacting the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Please note that NHTSA does not send owners safety recall notifications. Manufacturers are required to send recall notifications to the owner they have on record based on the most current registration information. Owners may continue to receive recall notices on their former vehicle for a while after it is sold or traded. However, you should not receive recall notices for a former vehicle for several years. We recommend that you contact Mazda, a local dealer, and your State Department of Motor Vehicles and report that you no longer own the vehicle. Until the registration information is updated, you may continue to receive recall and other communications associated with your former vehicle from the manufacturer.
