I wanted to add to my safety notice the Australia recall of FIATs because of seat problems. Shouldn't the manufacturer have notified the NHTSA about that recall?

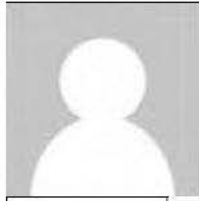

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Fiat Chrysler (FCA) has issued a recall in Australia for 12 vehicles from its 2015 model-year Fiat 500 and Abarth 500 lines, citing concerns over the front seats.

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The company reports the front seat's guide tracks may not comply to safety standards do to a manufacturing fault.

If the guide tracks are faulty, the seat could suddenly shift backwards or forwards during a crash, which poses an increased risk of injury.
