I purchased my 2018 Hyundai Santa Fe Sport on April 10, 2019 with 46946 miles, today's mileage is 120908. This vehicle is the best one I have owned in my [REDACTED] years. The only service to this vehicle was 4 new tires, a new battery and regular oil change.

On Wednesday May [REDACTED] 2023 as my wife and I were driving along the highway the engine oil light flashed on for a second and then off, about one minute later the engine oil light flashed on for a second and then off again. I stopped the vehicle to check the oil thinking that the engine oil was maybe one quart low, but to my surprise there was no, zero oil on the dipstick. How could this happen? No warning until the oil pan was 4 quarts low.

I am still thanking God, because I could be here today

without my truck to drive and a payment.

My question is: Why the engine oil light did not come on until there was almost no oil in the oil pan? There are no oil leaks under the vehicle. I am a retired Automotive Technician with 37 years for the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, DC., and I have never seen this before.

What happen to the warning and where did the oil go?

Is there a recall on the Engine Oil Warning Light?
