I am enclosing a copy of the long awaited Safety Recall decision for my Hyundai Elantra VIN: 5NPDH4AE3DH[REDACTED].

The letter says "the Hyundai dealer will replace the ABS fuse".
Replacing the fuse will NOT correct the problem.
The ABS Module will continue to leak.
The fire and/or explosion hazard will not be removed.

Having a fuse installed will increase the hazard because the first action taken by most owners and service people is to replace the fuse.
At the moment of replacement another spark could ignite a fire.
Or the fuse could blow repeatedly and be replaced repeatedly - increasing the possibility of a fire or worse.
The spark could occur at the moment of fuse replacement .

The correct action is to replace the ABS module with a non-leaker and isolate the module from electrical components.
