Thank you for the letter about your model year (MY) 2023 GMC Yukon vehicle. Your letter was forwarded to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Office of Defects Investigation. NHTSA's mission is to save lives, prevent injuries, and reduce economic costs due to road traffic crashes, through education, research, safety standards, and enforcement activity. I am pleased to respond.

We appreciate the report you provided. Among other enforcement activities, NHTSA continuously monitors available information to identify potential safety defect trends. As such, reports from motorists are a very important source of information for us. Your MY 2023 GMC Yukon is affected by NHTSA Safety Recall Campaign No. 25V274. As you know, the connecting rod and/or crankshaft engine components may have manufacturing defects that can lead to engine damage and engine failures in certain MY 2021 through MY 2024 GMC Yukon vehicles, among other General Motors (GM) vehicles equipped with 6.2L V8 gas engines.

We understand your concerns with the parts delay for Recall 25V274. Please note that it is not unusual for manufacturers to have an inadequate inventory of recall parts shortly after a recall is announced. Recall parts availability can be affected by numerous factors including, but not limited to, redesign, testing, manufacturing, and logistics. GM has informed NHTSA that due to the volume of affected vehicles, Recall 25V274 is being conducted in three phases. You should receive the final notice indicating the recall is ready in late November or early December 2025. We encourage you to continue to follow up with GM and your dealer on the status of the parts availability for Recall 25V274.
