#### A. DESCRIPTION OF THE ACCIDENT SEQUENCE AND ACCIDENT PECULIARITIES

(Provide a summary of the accident sequence as well as any particular event of the accident that is noteworthy. Pedestrian injury mechanism and vehicle interaction is the focus, not pedestrian or driver culpability. Do not include any personal identifiers.)

Vehicle #1 was traveling south on a two-lane roadway and stopped at a stop sign. After stopping at the stop sign, vehicle #1 turned left onto another two-lane roadway eastbound. Vehicle #1, during his turn, struck Pedestrian #1 who was crossing the road from south to north. The front right bumper struck the left side of the pedestrian, who then wrapped upon the hood and was carried approximately three meters before he rolled off the hood onto the ground. The vehicle came to final rest immediately prior to the final rest of the pedestrian.



#### Pedestrian Definition:

Any person who is on a trafficway or on a sidewalk or path contiguous with a trafficway, or on private property (e.g., parking lot).

Note: Pedestrians include persons who are in contact with the ground, roadway, etc. and are pushing carts, wagons, etc. or holding

Persons in or on a nonmotorist conveyance are <u>not</u> pedestrians and are excluded from this study. A nonmotorist conveyance is defined as any human powered device by which a nonmotorist may move, or by which a pedestrian or nonmotorist may move another nonmotorist. A nonmotorist conveyance for purposes of this study includes the following: bicycles, baby carriages, roller skates/blades, push carts, scooters, wheelchairs, animals, etc. For example, persons on a bicycle/scooter, roller skating/blading, in a baby carriage/push cart/wheelchair or on a horse are excluded.

#### Case Selection Criteria:

A <u>forward moving</u>, late model year (VEH04 equals 90 to 95) CDS applicable vehicle (VEH07 equals 01 to 49) must strike a pedestrian.

The striking portion of the vehicle structure must be original equipment manufacturer (OEM) without previous damage and or parts removed in the impact area. For example, vehicles equipped with deer guards, winches, snow plows, etc. or previously damaged in the impact area are excluded.

The pedestrian may not be lying or sitting.

The pedestrian impact(s) are the vehicle's <u>only</u> impact(s). If multiple pedestrians are impacted, each pedestrian shall be a separate case.

The first point of contact between the late model year, CDS applicable vehicle and the pedestrian must be forward of the top of the A pillar.


