**REPORT OF A SAFETY RECALL OR OTHER SAFETY CAMPAIGN
IN A FOREIGN COUNTRY**

1. Manufacturer

Nissan Motor Company, Ltd., Japan.

2. Vehicles Potentially Involved

Nissan Patrol vehicles produced from January 30, 2010 to April 22, 2010 at the Nissan Shatai Co., Ltd., Kyushu plant in Japan. No vehicles sold in the United States are affected because they use a different ECM (Engine Control Module) as discussed below.

3. Total Number of Vehicles Potentially Involved

Total: Approximately 1,604.

4. Description of the Defect

An IC (Integrated Circuit) in the ECM (Engine Control Module) may not meet the specification for voltage fluctuations. As a result, when the ambient temperature of the ECM in the engine compartment becomes high, the performance of the IC against the voltage fluctuation will deteriorate and the IC may break. This can cause a fuse for the fuel injection to blow out. If this occurs, the engine may stall and cannot be restarted.

5. Foreign Country in which the Safety Recall or Other Safety Campaign is Being Conducted

Saudi Arabia, UAE, Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman and Qatar.

6. Date of Determination

June 30, 2010.

7. Determination Made By

Manufacturer

8. Date the Recall or Other Campaign will Commence

Mid-July, 2010.

9. Descriptive of Corrective Action

Owners of potentially affected vehicles will be notified to take their vehicle to a dealer. The ECM will be replaced with a counter-measured one.

10. Vehicles in the United States (If known)

The following vehicles sold in the U.S. are on a similar "platform" as the Nissan Patrol vehicles sold in the above countries:

Model year 2005-2010 Nissan Frontier, Pathfinder, Xterra;

Model year 2009-2010 Suzuki Equator and;

Model year 2004-2010 Nissan Titan, Armada and Infiniti QX56.

U.S. vehicles are not identical or substantially similar from an engineering standpoint. As noted above, this issue affects no vehicles sold in the U.S. because U.S. vehicles use a different ECM.
