This Safety Recall involves vehicles that were manufactured and sold outside of the United States. General Motors sold substantially similar vehicles in the United States.

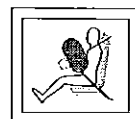

CONDITION:	The subject vehicles produced at Gunsan Assembly in South Korea may have been assembled with a rear seat belt anchor nut not installed to specification. With this condition, an occupant in this seating position may not be properly restrained in the event of a vehicle crash.
CORRECTION:	All involved vehicles will be inspected to assure that the rear seat belt anchor nut is installed to specification. Those units that are found to be out of specification will be corrected at no charge to the customer.

SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR U.S. VEHICLE:	Chevrolet Cruze
COMMENT:	The Substantially Similar Chevrolet Cruze, sold in the United States, is produced at the Lordstown Assembly Plant in Ohio. Lordstown Assembly has verified that the process issue that led to the installation error does not exist at that plant. The 2011 Chevrolet Cruze models produced at Gunsan Korea are not exported to the United States. Therefore, there are no involved vehicles in the United States.
