RE: TREAD Act Required Report of a Recall in a Foreign Country

Dear Mr. Brown:

Pursuant to the TREAD Act and Section 579.11 of Part 579 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and on behalf of Hyundai Motor Company (“HMC”), Hyundai Motor America (“HMA”) is submitting information concerning a recall that is being voluntarily initiated in the Korean market. Specific information as required by Section 579.12 of Part 579 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations is as follows:

Identification of the vehicles potentially containing the defect:

Model year 2017 Hyundai Maxcruz vehicles for sale in the Korean market.

Total number of vehicles potentially containing the defect:

Two Hyundai Hyundai Maxcruz vehicles produced September 28, 2016 through September 30, 2016 for sale in the Korean market.

Description of the defect/noncompliance:

Due to a malfunction of factory calibration equipment, the headlamp aim adjustment may be out of specification, reducing nighttime visibility and increasing the risk of a crash.

Foreign country in which the safety recall or other safety campaign is being conducted:

This campaign is being conducted in the Korean market.

Description of the foreign action as a safety recall or other safety campaign:

A safety recall.

Determination to conduct the recall made by the manufacturer or by a foreign government:

The determination to conduct this recall was made by Hyundai Motor Company.

Manufacturer's program for remedying the defect or noncompliance:

All owners of affected vehicles will be contacted to have the headlamp aim on their vehicles corrected.

Date of the determination and the date the recall was commenced in each foreign country:

The determination to conduct this recall was made on November 8th, 2016. Owner notification began on November 14th, 2016.

Identify all motor vehicles sold or offered for sale in the United States that are identical or substantially similar to the motor vehicles covered by the foreign recall or campaign:

The Korean market specification model year 2016 Hyundai Maxcruz is substantially similar to the U.S. specification model year 2016 Hyundai Santa Fe; however, the headlamps for the U.S. specification model year 2016 Hyundai Santa Fe are adjusted at the headlamp vendor prior to vehicle assembly. Therefore, this foreign market recall does not affect vehicles sold in the United States.
