Mr Klvett,

I have sent a couple of e-mails and hadn't received any replies as of yet so I wasn't sure you had received them. Could you please answer a couple of questions for me? First, is there a separate investigation going on for the Dodge Dakota Quads and what is the number of complaints for this vehicle? Is the number you last quoted (749) inclusive of both the Durango and the Dakota Quad or is that just the Durango? The EA03-023 has only Durangos listed.

Also, are you going to add the Dakota Quad to the query list for service bulletins? FYI, There is also a problem with the brakes on these vehicles, warped rotors and major pulsing and vibrating when applying brake. The front end on these vehicles obviously can't handle the stress put on it. Between the ball joints and the brakes, this vehicle is junk.

Please, please issue a recall!!! Daimier Chrysler is shutting out myself and all the many other customers who are having these issues. They won't take responsibility on their own. They would rather let someone get injured or killed instead of doing the right thing and admit there is a problem and correct it. Money is obviously most important to them. Our pleas are falling on deaf ears at Dalmier Chrysler. I believe they are stalling in hopes a recall won't be issued and these vehicles will be out of warranty and they can soak us for more repairs.

I will send you their replies and you can see for yourself.

They are already scamming us on the front end alignment needed after the upper control arm us replaced.

I would appreciate some answers to my previous questions so that I may better defend my position if and when it becomes necessary to pursue in court.

an after market part which will have a grease fitting.

Another issue: I complained from the first week of buying my truck new (as of 12/00) about a "clunk" in the front left suspension. They could never hear it. It has only continued to get louder and now I'm told this ball joint is the culprit.

somehow and thought this was a first best guess.

#### Peter,

I understand you are the lead investigator on the ball joint problems on the Dodge Dakotas. It have a brand new 2004 Dakota that has a ball joint squeak starting already at just over 4000 miles. The local garage I took it to tells me that it is the start of the ball joint problems that Dakota's are notorious for. My short investigation on the internet turned up all kinds of discussion and expensive homor stories. My son has a 2002 Dakota which has had the ball joints replaced 3 times also.

Obviously, this is a major design flaw and a significant safety hazard. According to the article on CBS, if these aren't taken care of, they will separate and the wheel comes off. Replacement of these parts by DaimlerChrysler is not enough. DaimlerChrysler needs to redesign these and the NHTSA needs to insist that they recall the effected vehicles and replace the ball joints with the redesigned parts.

And soon, as far as I'm concerned this problem is very much the same as the Ford tire problem. Let's not wait until all the loss of life that was experienced with that problems begins with the Dodge Dakota's and Durango's. I don't think the NHTSA wants that on their conscience.

Please let me know what your investigation has found and what recommendation the NHTSA will be making and in what time frame. I would like to get my ball joints fixed with non-defective, correctly designed parts.

I brought it into the shop and they are now telling me the upper and lower ball joints are bad. Being that this is a costly repair (at least if you have it done at the dealer) of about \$1000 I decided to do some investigating. My email is about my Dodge Dekota and ball joint front end problems.

I own a 1996 Dodge Dakota SLT 4X4 that just broke 27000 miles. I recently moved to New Maxico from New Jersey to continue on my BS in Electrical Engineering. I have the commonly reported "popping" noise in my front end, and loose steering. My Ball joints are rusted and loose as well. Since I rely on this truck to get to school, and I must travel 71 miles through the desert, therefore this is making me very nervous.

The Local dealer in Alamogordo, NM told me the ball joints were ok and there is no problem. Apparently Dodge is not concerned that their vehicle's steering is very loose. My truck is elso still under warranty, 7 year 50,000 mile coverage.

is there anything I can do to actually get Dodge to take care of this common problem? The company, through the 800 number, 2 dealerships in New Jersey, and 1 in New Medico all seems to not be responsive.

It is startling that, from my presumption, that manufacturers must be calculating replacement costs, vs. accidental from faulty equipment. Especially after the Ford Motor Co. situation with their Explorers.

I Imagine that Ethics is not part of this corporation either.

Hello, Do I need to send an e-mail to you or submit a problem report through the NHTSA WEB site? This is pertaining to the bad ball joint investigation you are running. I have had problems with my front end since I have had 10,000 mile or so on my truck. I would have to look through my paper work to get the exact mileage. To give you history on my truck, I have gone through a bad computer, cracking factory paint, a shorted interior fan switch, techs breaking wheel locks, and front end suspension problems. The front end originally was loose, when I took it in for that, the tech said there were missing bolts that they replaced with bolts from Ace Hardware. Then the front end started making a loud noise when making turns, so I asked them to look into the front end and they said they could not find anything, but greased some parts. The truck still made the noise, about 4 to 5 trips to service, they finally rebuilt the whole left front, with everything but ball joints, a new steering rack, and other parts. I moved in this period of time, and took the truck to a different dealer a couple cities away, and they replaced the ball joints. This took care of the problem for about a few weeks. I think the problem with the 2000 + Dakota quad cabs is that the front suspension is not designed for the extra weight that it carries over the standard or extra cab model. The torsion bars are the same, and I think that makes the front end actually bottom out against the bump stops. The quad cab is the only one of the models that came standard with Nitrogen shocks to try and compensate for some of the weight. The other thing that is common with trucks is that the new 6 x 114 bolt pattern will cause the brakes to warp unless torqued down hard. This puts more stress on the front end. Dodge needs to be told they need to redesign the front end to handle the weight. Please help out the 10's of 1000's of Dakota owners. Sorry for the rambling on.

I understand you are looking into problems with Dodge Trucks front suspension. I am not sure what good it will do, but please ad my name to the list of dissatisfied Dodge owners. I have a 2000 Dodge Durango STL 4.7 V-8 with 78,000 miles. I have complained about front end noise since shortly after I bought it in 2000. Today I was informed I needed to replace the upper control arms, at a coal of over \$700 (including recommended front end alignment & tune-up \$1250). 
An you are probably aware, your email address has been published as a possible individual who is involved with analyzing the issue surrounding the premature failure upper and lower ball joints on Dodge Dakota and Durango vehicles. If this information is incorrect, please accept my applogies and perhaps you could forward this message on to the correct individual(s).

I am the owner of a 1998 Dodge Dakota pickup with 49,000 miles on the OD. I have been experiencing symptoms for quite some time now that I can only describe as "a loose sensation within the front suspension". It literally feels like the wheels are going to fall off. After reading the many complaints that have been posted on the web about this bell joint issue, I am understandably concerned about the dangers that may be involved with my own vehicle.

If my understanding is correct, the Chrysler Corporation, while aware of the complaints, is unconcerned about the seventy since "there have been no reported deaths or significant injuries" resulting from this issue. I also understand that there may be one or more class action suits pending, but as of now no related safety recalls have been issued.

I am writing to you today to urge you to exercise any influence you have within NHTSA to expedite Engineering Analysis EA03-023, and upon determining — se I am sure you will — that there is significant reason to believe the stock ball joints pose a safety threat will take the necessary action to help vehicle owners resolve the situation.

I got your e-mail address from another Dakota owner who said he'd been in contact with you re: the Dakota Ball Joints.

I'm sure you've heard stories similar to mine many times by now, but add my name to the list. I'm probably not as 'angered' by this as many, but it doesn't seem right that Dodge can make a subpar part, put it in the truck, and then expect the owners to foot the bill for repeated repairs. Here's my story:

I bought my brand new Dakota in June Of 2002. Drove it off the lot with all of 15 miles on the odometer. I've put around 20k per year on it. It now has 48k.

At about 6k, I started noticing a 'scrunch' type sound in the front suspension whenever I pulled into my driveway. At first, I thought maybe it was a tire rub (the tires are pretty wide...), but no evidence of this. I kept listening for it as it got worse and worse (more and more constant), until around 24,000 when I finally had it checked. The dealer replaced both hall joints at no cost.

At around 30,000 or so, it started again. Again, same thing. Gradually got worse. It's got 48,000 on it now. It's not as bad as it was at 24,000, but I took it in for service.

I just got off the phone with the dealer. He's claiming 'they can't make it make the sound'. He's listed out a few things it 'might be' lubricating steering stops, and a couple of other things. We'll see if he's right...

Anyway, just wanted to add my name to the list of people with trouble with these Dakotas. It's an absolute shame - as nice of a truck as the Dakota is - that they're not better mechanically than they seem to be. They're scaring off a whole lot of potential buyers - people who bought them because of how nice they are, and now say they'll 'have to do something else next time' because of the trouble.

Based upon info I found on the Internet you are a good contact to voice a complaint to about early ball joint fature on a 2003 Dodge Dakota. My car's front ball joint hegen squeeking at about 20,000 miles or earlier but I didn't realize the severity of the noise. At 40,000 I inspected the joint myself because the squeek was now a clunk and the noise was constant. When I took it to the dealer they said I had to replace both upper joints at a cost of almost \$600. Not having many options I did this. This is when I checked the internet for recalls. It appears that lots of owners are complaining of this same problem. The dealer replaced only the ball joints. They drilled out the rivets and botted the new units in. The new units only have a 12000 mile warrantee... no better than my originals. If this is going to be an ongoing issue I would say that these units are defective but yet there is no remedy to fix. Is it right that I can plan to spend 500 every 16 or 20000 miles? The dealer's attitude seemed to be that if the unit's failure caused an accident, Chrysler will deal with it.
