This letter and CD-ROM are hereby submitted to NHTSA in support of NVS-212jfa / PE05-041, Electronic Throttle Module.

The information being submitted is considered by Volvo to be confidential, and an affidavit to support that claim is enclosed. This confidential information includes the following documents provided on the enclosed CD-ROM:

We firmly believe that the release of the above stated confidential information would make public Volvo proprietary information that could cause substantial competitive harm to Volvo Car Corporation and to Volvo Cars North America, LLC (Volvo) for the following reasons:

- Alleged Product failure Incident reports are prepared in response only to unique Customer Complaints. These reports were prepared because the Consumer Complaints alleged a crash occurred. In general, when a Volvo customer alleges a crash or certain other unique circumstances, these reports are prepared in reasonable saticipation of potential hitigation. For this reason it is extremely important to Volvo that it be held proprietary and held confidential. Release of this information to the public or Volvo's competition could cause substantial competitive harm to Volvo.
- The reports provided are confidential and proprietary information and have never been released to
 the public and there is no intention to ever release this information to the public. We have verified
 that only those associated with this information and information preparation have had access to this
 information.

Therefore we request that the confidential information be treated within the meaning of confidential business information pursuant to 5USC 552(b)(4) and Section 112(c) of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966 as amended and implemented in 49 CFR Part 512.

In accordance with 49 CFR 512.4(a)(4), we are submitting one (1) copy of each of the above documents to your office containing the confidential information, and one (1) copy of each of the above documents to your office with the confidential information omitted.

Also, in accordance with 49 CFR 512.4(a)(1), each page containing confidential information has been marked "confidential", and in accordance with 49 CFR 512.4(a)(2), each item of confidential information within this page has been placed within brackets "[]". When an entire page is confidential this page has been marked "confidential" at the top of the page and no brackets have been used.
