Summary:

On April 26, 2006, GM notified the agency that it will conduct a Safety Recall (NHTSA #06V-139) for model year (MY) 2004-2006 Colorado and Canyon and MY 2006 Isuzu I-280 and I-350 light duty pickup vehicles. GM indicated in the Part 573 letter that the cause of the brake lamp switch failure was insufficient plating thickness on the stationary contact.

Since that time, ODI has received nine complaints from subject vehicle owners alleging intermittent and repeated brake lamp switch malfunctions of the Recall Remedy switch. Some of the complainants indicated close calls from approaching vehicles and one owner (VOQ#10202893) alleged that his vehicle was lightly struck from behind at a stop light due to his brake lights not working.
