I have concluded that the public release of the materials marked confidential on the CD-ROM entitled "PE11-034, CONFIDENTIAL Honda Response, 11/22/11" would be likely to cause substantial competitive harm to your company and, therefore, that this information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Exemption 4 of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4).
