NARRATIVE

On the above date and time, Sgt. Burns, Ofc. Stolte, Ofc. Maritz and I were dispatched to [REDACTED] for a residential fire.

Dispatch advised me that the resident advised that a vehicle fire started from an electric car charger in the garage and the house is on fire. While en route, Ofc. Stolte advised Dispatch to have the residents exit the house.

I arrived on scene with Ofc. Stolte and Ofc. Maritz and the garage was engulfed with fire. Ofc. Stolte, Ofc. Maritz and I then confirmed that everyone was out of the house. The resident identified as [REDACTED] then stated that he believes the fire started from the electric charger to his vehicle (a blue 2019 Chevy Bolt bearing NJ Registration [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] then stated that the vehicle was plugged into the charger overnight.

[REDACTED] stated that him, his wife identified as [REDACTED] and his son identified as [REDACTED] were sleeping inside the house and woke up to the fire alarm. [REDACTED] then stated that they went downstairs to the garage and saw a fire and visible explosions coming from the Chevy Bolt. [REDACTED] then stated that he then tried to distinguish the fire but was unable to so they then exited the house. [REDACTED] also advised me that there was another vehicle (a blue 2013 Honda Pilot bearing NJ Registration # [REDACTED]) in the garage.

Monroe Fire Department then arrived on scene and began putting out the fire. Ofc. Stolte then advised the residents of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to exit their residences for safety reasons.

Sgt. Burns then arrived on scene and we then secured the scene. Sgt. Burns then notified the Duty Officer, Lt. Solomons to advise her of the incident. Lt. Solomons then advised Sgt. Burns to have the on call Detectives respond to the scene to conduct an investigation.

Det. Sgt. Saloom, Det. Dzema & Det. Degraw were then called in and arrived on scene and conducted their investigation. Det. Sgt. Saloom then advised me that it appears that the fire started from the garage.

Monroe Fire Department successfully put out the fire. I then observed that the garage was severely damaged and both aforementioned vehicles were burned and totaled. Sgt. Burns and I then checked the inside of the residence and we observed that the inside of the house obtained fire and smoke damage. Sgt. Burns and I then caution taped the perimeter of the residence.

Cleared scene. Nothing further.

NARRATIVE

On 10/21/2020, I was advised by Dsgt. Saloom to respond to [REDACTED] for a working structure fire.

At approximately 0537 hrs., I arrived at the aforementioned location. Already present on scene were DSgt. Saloom, Sgt. Burns, and Ofc. Tyson along with firefighters from the Monroe Township and Spotswood Fire Departments and members of Monroe Township First Aid. Also on scene was Fire Inspector Ernie Zih.

I then met with DSgt. Saloom who informed me that police and fire were contacted at approximately 0312 hrs by the resident [REDACTED], reporting that visible flames were seen coming from their electric car (2019 Chevrolet Bolt N. [REDACTED]) which was parked inside the garage; also that the entire residence was filled with smoke. Upon the arrival of patrol on scene, they found it to be a working structure fire. Monroe Township Fire Department along with assistance from the Spotswood Fire Department arrived on scene and extinguished the flames.

Weather Conditions:

Areas of Dense Fog approximately 60 degrees Fahrenheit with a wind coming from the Southeast at 3 mph. This information was received from the National Weather Service for the Belmar/Farmingdale area, New Jersey for Wednesday, October 21, 2020 at approximately 0312 hrs.

Interviews:

I then spoke with the residents, [REDACTED] (husband), [REDACTED] (wife), and [REDACTED] (son). I was advised that the smoke alarm inside the residence began sounding which had awoken the residents. They began checking each room of the house in order to locate the fire detection device that was sounding. [REDACTED] continued by saying that after not being able to locate the device, she decided to check the garage. Upon opening the mudroom door which leads directly to the garage, she observed flames coming from the Chevrolet Bolt. She ran back inside and retrieved a fire extinguisher, but had difficulties removing the pin in order to make it operational. According to [REDACTED] she then attempted to extinguish the flames coming from the vehicle with no avail. She continued by saying that at this time, the smoke became so overwhelming that she could barely see. While attempting to extinguish the [REDACTED] stated that she heard many "popping sounds" coming from the area. She then retreated back into the residence to alert her family, but was unsure whether or not she had closed the interior garage door/mudroom door.

[REDACTED] advised that while [REDACTED] was attempting to extinguish the flames, he went down to the basement in order to shut off some of the breakers in the electric panel. He was unsure, however, which breakers he shut off. A short time later, [REDACTED] was able to get [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] out of the residence through the front door to safety.

Description of the Scene:

The structure involved, [REDACTED], Monroe Twp, NJ, is a two story wood-frame, single family dwelling. The front door to the residence is located on exterior side "A". (Side "B" followed by "C" and "D" continue clockwise around the residence) The exterior of the residence is covered by aluminum siding and has an asphalt shingle pitched roof with solar panels on sides "B" and "C" and a full size basement. There is also a wooden porch located on exterior side "B" and "C".

The structure contained a three (3) car garage on exterior side "B". For reporting purposes garage door #1 will be

the Northernmost door and garage door #3 will be the Southernmost door (From exterior side A clockwise to exterior side B.) Contained behind garage door 1 parked facing East was 2013 Honda Pilot [REDACTED] nothing was contained behind #2, contained behind door #3 was the 2019 Chevrolet Bolt [REDACTED].

The interior walls and ceilings of the structure were covered in sheet rock and the floors covered by hardwood. Contained on the first floor of the structure were the following rooms: bedroom complete with bathroom, laundry/mudroom, dining room, kitchen, living room, office. The second floor consisted of the following rooms: master bedroom with bath and closet and sitting area, two more bedrooms and another bathroom. The basement remained unfinished and contained most of the utilities: three (3) HVAC, two (2) hot water heaters, electric panels, sub-panel for car charger, Verizon cable, solar control panel and solar ac disconnect.

Located on the exterior of the residence on the "B" side of the residence was the electric meter which had been removed by JCP&L prior to our arrival. Located on the exterior "D" side of the residence was the PSE&G gas meter, serial number [REDACTED] and reading [REDACTED]. Located in the basement were two (2) electric panels and one (1) sub electric panel.

During the incident, the three (3) garage doors located on exterior side "B" were all closed. Upon arrival of Monroe Fire, it appeared as if the garage door farthest South, garage door 3, appeared partially open or that the bottom panel had blown out.

- "On": Main, breaker #4 (outlet/lights),
- "Off": breakers 17-26
- "Tripped": breakers 1) outlet lights, 2) furnace, 13) basement lights, 5/6) outlets, 7) lights, 8) outlets, 9/10) outlets, 11) smoke & CO detectors, 12) outlets, 13/14) lights, 15) furnace 2, 16) furnace 3

Panel #2

- "On": Main, breaker 1) dishwasher, 2) GFI kitchen island, 4) dining outlets 8/9) A/C compressor #2, 10/11) A/C compressor #3
- "Off": 12) outlets, 14) garbage disposal, 15) bathroom gfi/outlets, 16) gfi basement, 17/18) sub panel, 19/20) wall ovens, 21) emergency panel
- "Tripped": 3) gfi/kitchen outlet 5) attic, 6) emergency panel, 7) laundry outlet 13) lights

Let it be noted breaker # 17/18 on Panel #2 appear to feed the sub panel that controls the charging unit for the Chevrolet Bolt. Breaker # 17/18 was shut "Off", seemingly cutting power to the sub panel with all breakers still "On"*

Investigation of the Scene:

At the conclusion of the fire extinguishment operations, DSgt. Saloom and myself photographed the exterior of the residence and the garage including both vehicles, the Honda Pilot and Chevrolet Bolt. Let it be noted that we were unable to locate VIN tags on each vehicle due to severe damage that had occurred. Fire Investigator Ernie Zih had completed his Origin and Cause Investigation prior to my arrival.

The first floor bedroom/bath, laundry/mud room, dining room and second floor bedroom located on the "B" side of structure sustained the most fire damage. According to Investigator Zih, the fire began at the charging port of the Chevrolet Bolt which was located on the left front fender. The charging cord which lead from this port was connected to an outlet on the "C" side of the garage. The remnants of the charging cord were located on the floor leading from the wall outlet to the charging port of the vehicle. The fire which burned extremely hot then continued upward towards the second floor bedroom and out towards the "C" side of the garage. After continuing across the garage and breaching the doors, the Honda Pilot also became engulfed. Once the fire had continued past garage side "C", it blew out the rear window behind the garage where it extended up to the rear of the residence. According to Monroe Township Fire, the chandelier in the foyer of side "A" showed electrical burn/singe marks on the ceiling around it.

According to the resident, the Chevrolet Bolt was not experiencing any sort of mechanical issues and had also not had any recalls present. The charging cord, when not in use, remained coiled on garage wall "C", it was never run over by the vehicle. The charging panel was installed over a year ago by a licensed electrician (resident unsure of the company) and never experienced any problems as well. The vehicle was plugged into the charging port since approximately 1500 hrs. on 10/20.

DSgt. Saloom then made notification to Nick Chiorello of the Middlesex County Arson Unit regarding the incident.

Conclusion:

Upon reviewing all aspects of the investigation, to include the interviews, scene investigation, review of photographs of the scene and reports associated with investigation, it is the consensus of all involved that the fire be considered undetermined pending further investigation. Note: The vehicle charging system could not be ruled out as the cause.

A Monroe Township firefighter (Justin Pieron) sustained an injury to his right ankle during the performance of his duties. He was treated on scene by Monroe Township First Aid and released.

On 10/22/2020, Det. DeGraw and I responded back to the residence in order to meet with the Fire Inspector Zih and Monroe Township Construction Official, Lou Buonocore, in order to further investigate the incident. While still at the residence [REDACTED] provided me a copy of the invoice for the installation of the electric car charger and sub panel which was then included with this report. At this time, they deemed the residence an "unsafe structure".

Damage: Extensive damage to structures including bedroom over garage, laundry room, kitchen, and dining area. Heavy smoke and heat damaged remaining areas of home.

Fire Travel: Fire traveled from garage / vehicle to upstairs stairway leading to laundry room, vertically to upstairs bedroom.

Burn-through points: Fire Fighters reported heavy fire in garage and upper level of structure upon arrival.

Origin / Heat indications: Chevy Bolt was completely destroyed, origin around area of front driver's side door. Remains of charging cord found in debris found in that area. Vehicle was backed into garage and cord was plugged into outlet on left side wall facing garage. Cord went from outlet, around front of car, to car receptacle. Only the metal strands remained at both ends of the cord.

Occupant Statement:

██████████ reported that the garaged Chevy Bolt was plugged into the garage receptacle at approximately 3 PM on October 20, the previous afternoon.

Around 3 AM, the ██████████ reported hearing the smoke detectors, and ██████████ found smoke in the front area of the garage. The ██████████ grabbed a fire extinguisher while the son called 9-1-1, but the smoke was too heavy to enter the garage.

██████████ reported that the smoke / fire was in the front of the garage area but could not be specific. A garden hose was stretched but could not reach the front of the garage.

The Chevy Bolt was being charged at the time of the fire. The area around the vehicle could not be ruled out as a point of origin.

Conclusion:

The fire was ruled undetermined pending further investigation. Note: the vehicle and charging system could not be ruled out as the cause.
