DEFECT INFORMATION REPORT

1. Manufacturer:

Nissan North America, Inc.

2. Vehicles Potentially Involved:

2004 model year Nissan Xterra vehicles produced from July 13 to 20, 2004 and equipped with a Nissan accessory tow hitch installed at the post-production vehicle processing center. Only vehicles produced during this period may have the described defect and no other Nissan models use the same hitch.

3. Total Number of Vehicles Potentially Involved:

131

4. Percentage of Vehicles Estimated to Actually Contain the Defect:

Unknown

5. Description of the Defect:

The worker responsible for installing the Nissan tow hitch on vehicles produced during the above production period may not have tightened the attachment bolts to the proper specification.

The manufacturer of the hitch is:

6. Chronology of Principal Events

August 2, 2004 – Quality control inspection on tow hitch installation identified an under-torqued bolt.

August – November 2004 – An investigation was conducted to determine the affected vehicle population and whether a potential risk to safety existed.

December 1, 2004 – Nissan determined that a safety related defect might exist and that a recall campaign should be conducted.

7. <u>Description of Corrective Action:</u>

Nissan plans to notify owners of potentially affected vehicles on January 3, 2005. The hitch attaching bolts will be torqued to the proper specification.
