SUBJECT: 126,624 GM 1997-2004 Chevrolet Corvette passenger vehicles equipped with electronic column lock systems (ECL) and manufactured from September 1996 through January 2004. When the ignition switch is turned to "lock," the ECL prevents turning of the steering system. When the vehicle is started, the ECL unlocks the steering system. The vehicle is designed so that if the column falls to unlock when the vehicle is started and the customer tries to drive, the fuel supply will be shut off so that the vehicle cannot move when the vehicle cannot be steered. If voltage at the Powertrain Control Module is low or interrupted, however, the fuel shut off may not occur and the vehicle can be accelerated while the steering system is locked. GM Recall No. 04006.
